Most Preschoolers Should

by 3 years:

- go up steps, alternating feet
- speak in 3-word sentences
- imitate adults doing simple tasks

by 4 years:

- build a tower of 8-10 blocks
- match some objects and colors
- feed themselves with a fork
- be understood by non-family members

by 5 years:

- catch a ball with their hands
- follow two-step directions
- count to five
- sort objects by color, shape, and size
