Medications at School

Students are not permitted to self-medicate while in school, with the exception of emergency inhalers and epi-pens. All medications will be dispensed through the nurse's office. Medication, which includes prescription and over the counter medicines, is not to be sent to school with students. Students bringing medication to school is a violation of the Drug and Alcohol Policy. Parents or designated adults are responsible to bring medication in a properly labeled prescription bottle or original packaging along with a completed district medication form signed by the parent and doctor. Doctor signatures are required for over the counter medications. Ask your pharmacist for a separate bottle for school if your child also takes the medication at home.

Provisions are made for responding to your child's health needs that may include administering common over the counter medicines. Per orders by our school doctor, the nurses may dispense Tylenol, Advil, Tums, Oragel, Hydrocortisone cream, Benadryl, Neosporin, and cough drops if the parent has also given permission on the yearly Back to School Update.
